Alberta direct cattle sales saw light trade develop with dressed sales reported at 400.00 delivered, 10.00 higher than the previous week. Cattle that traded this week would be picked up in 1-2 weeks. So far this week one packer has bought the majority of the cattle. With basis levels strengthening US packer interest on the Western Canadian cash market has been quiet. Tentatively Alberta fed prices are at the highest

point since July 2023. The price spread between Alberta and Ontario has narrowed in recent weeks. Alberta fed prices are now par with the Ontario market.



As of 3:00 PM Friday in the Southern Plains, negotiated cash has been at a standstill. The most recent market in the Southern Plains was Thursday with live FOB purchases at 186.00. In Nebraska and the Western Cornbelt negotiated cash has been mostly inactive on light demand. 





Beef:

Net sales of 12,700 MT for 2024 were up 15 percent from the previous week and 4 percent from the prior 4-week average. Increases were primarily for South Korea (3,400 MT, including decreases of 400 MT), Japan (3,400 MT, including decreases of 600 MT), China (2,000 MT, including decreases of 100 MT), Mexico (1,000 MT), and Taiwan (1,000 MT, including decreases of 100 MT).

Exports of 14,100 MT were down 3 percent from the previous week and 10 percent from the prior 4-week average. The destinations were primarily to Japan (3,500 MT), South Korea (3,500 MT), China (2,300 MT), Mexico (1,400 MT), and Taiwan (1,100 MT).

Pork:

Net sales of 55,300 MT for 2024--a marketing-year high--were up 64 percent from the previous week and 74 percent from the prior 4-week average. Increases primarily for Mexico (32,800 MT, including decreases of 400 MT), Japan (5,700 MT, including decreases of 500 MT), Australia (5,400 MT), Canada (5,000 MT, including decreases of 600 MT), and South Korea (2,800 MT, including decreases of 200 MT), were offset by reductions for Vietnam (1,300 MT).

Exports of 34,200 MT were up 6 percent from the previous week and 4 percent from the prior 4-week average. The destinations were primarily to Mexico (13,100 MT), Japan (5,500 MT), South Korea (4,800 MT), China (3,300 MT), and Colombia (2,000 MT).


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USDA National Retail Beef Report:

National Summary of Advertised Prices for Beef at Major Retail Supermarket Outlets

This week in beef retail the Feature Rate decreased by 2.5 percent and the Special Rate decreased by 3.5 percent. The Activity Index decreased by 4.6 percent. Cuts from the chuck, loin, and ground beef showed a decrease in ad space this week while cuts from the round and brisket showed a slight increase. Cuts from the rib showed the biggest change this week increasing in ad space by 86.1 percent.

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Est. Weekly Meat Production Under Federal Inspection:

Total red meat production under Federal inspection for the week ending Saturday, March 30, 2024 was estimated at 1013.7 million lbs. according to the USDA Marketing Service. This was 3.4 percent lower than a week ago and 5.5 percent lower than a year ago. Cumulative meat production for the year to date was 2 percent lower compared to the previous year.

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1 Year Bullish/Bearish Consensus Charts from SentimenTrader:

The theory behind the "Bullish/Bearish Consensus" indicator is when the public reaches a consensus, they are usually wrong:

They get too bullish after prices have risen and too bearish after they have already fallen.


Because of this tendency, there are often extremes in opinion right before major changes in trend:

- When the public reaches a bullish extreme, i.e., a great majority thinks prices will keep rising, then prices often decline instead.
- And when they become too bearish, then prices tend to rise.

So when Public Opinion moves above the **red dotted line** in the chart, it means that compared to other readings over the past year, you're seeing **excessive optimism**. You also want to look at the absolute level of Opinion, too - if it's at 90%, then there's no question we're seeing an historic level of bullish opinion. Watch for readings above 80% (or especially 90%) to spot those dangerous times when the public is overly enthusiastic about a commodity.

Conversely, when Public Opinion moves below the **green dotted line**, then the public is **excessively pessimistic** about the commodity's prospects for further gains compared to their opinion over the past

year. Looking for absolute readings under 20% (or especially 10%) often indicates an upturn in the market.




Corn Bullish/Bearish Consensus: 1 Year Chart

Stocks close out strong quarter with gains

Most of the major indexes advanced over the shortened trading week to end a quarter of strong gains. The S&P 500 Index recorded new closing and intraday highs to end the week. The market's advance was

notably broad, with an equal-weighted version of the S&P 500 Index gaining 1.64%, well ahead of the 0.39% increase in the more familiar market-weighted version. Small-caps also easily outperformed large-caps, and the Russell 1000 Value Index gained 1.79%, in contrast with the 0.60% decline in its growth counterpart. Markets were closed on Friday in observance of the Good Friday holiday but were scheduled to reopen on Monday in advance of many international markets.

Consumers grow more positive but remain worried

On Tuesday, the Conference Board announced that its index of consumer confidence declined slightly in March, defying consensus expectations for an increase. "Consumers' assessment of the present situation improved in March," the Board's chief researcher noted, "but they also became more pessimistic about the future."

Better news came on Thursday from the University of Michigan's rival gauge of consumer sentiment, which was revised upward to its highest level in 21 months, thanks in part to waning inflation fears. "Over the first three months of 2024, consumers have consistently expressed that the economy appears to be holding its course," its chief researcher noted. "However, with the general election looming on the horizon, many mentioned that their views remain tentative and subject to change."







Canadian 90-Day Percent of Average Precipitation:





Looking ahead...

During the weekend, precipitation will spread farther inland across the Great Basin, Intermountain West, and parts of the Southwest. Early next week, precipitation will return across the nation's mid-section, initially extending eastward from Colorado and Wyoming.

The NWS 6-to-10-day outlook for April 2–6 calls for the likelihood of near- or below-normal temperatures nationwide, except for warmer-than-normal weather in California, the Great Basin, northern New England, and southern Florida. Meanwhile, near- or above-normal precipitation across much of the country should contrast with drier-than-normal conditions in coastal sections of Oregon and northern California, as well as a broad area covering much of the eastern Plains, mid-South, and Midwest.

Precipitation & Temperature Outlooks:




